#### **EULAKS pursues the following objectives**

- to promote the role of the social sciences and humanities (SSH) in the EU-LAC policy dialogue on science and technology (S&T) cooperation
- to support current and future collaborative research endeavours in the field of SSH between the EU and LAC
- to strengthen networks that link social science communities and institutions to policymakers and practitioners in the EU and LAC

**The objectives of the project will be met through the implementation of activities such as**

#### **Analytical studies**

- a survey of patterns of cooperation in the SSH between the EU and LAC
- case studies of collaborative EU-LAC research networks
- case studies on the role of ICT in the development of knowledge networks in the EU and LAC
- analysis of the role of SSH research in the design and transformation of science, technology and innovation (STI) policy agendas in LAC countries
- a comparative analysis of Knowledge Society indicators in the EU and LAC

#### **Conference, workshops, and a summer school**

- an expert workshop about the use of foresight in guiding STI policy in the EU and LAC
- policy workshops
- a conference on the challenges of the Knowledge Society in the EU and LAC
- a joint summer school for young SSH scientists

#### **Dissemination activities**

- publication of an electronic newsletter
- establishment of a virtual learning network
- a policy paper and policy briefs
